Port of New Orleans Small Business Contracting Program:

Local and small businesses are a critical part of creating economic vitality in the region. As a part of the Port's Procurement objectives, we aim to increase the proportion of funds spent with qualified local and small business firms in construction, professional services, and goods and services.

The Port's *Small Business Contracting Program* is designed to develop mutually valuable professional relationships with local and small businesses to increase the number of small businesses, including minority-owned, women-owned, disadvantaged firms and Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Businesses applying and competing for Port contracts.

The Small Business Contracting Program Tracks Two Core Programs:

- Small Contractors and Suppliers (SCS) program
- Small Business Enterprise (SBE) program

Procurement Spending By The Numbers (FY19):

- Nearly **\$4.7 million** spent on purchases with SBE/DBE-owned businesses
- Engaged with **450** SBE/DBE vendors since June 2017
